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- Choose **ONE** of the two chapter books to create your own poster. Be creative! We will discuss these books during our author study the first week of school. This will be your first reading grade.



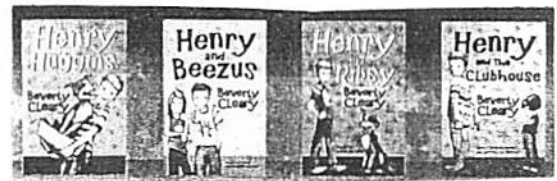
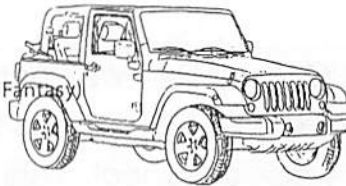

ask yourself three questions:*

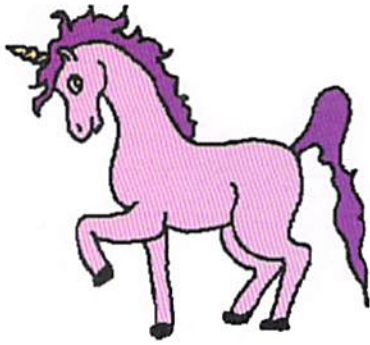
- 1. Can I understand it?*

Summer Math



To give the students a better understanding of multiplication I am requiring each rising 3rd grader to memorize every multiple from 2-10. Essentially I want the students to be able to skip count each number's multiples.

Numbers they will need to know:

2's: 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20

3's: 3, 6, 9, 12, 15, 18, 21, 24, 27, 30

4's: 4, 8, 12, 16, 20, 24, 28, 32, 36, 40

5's: 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 45, 50

6's: 6, 12, 18, 24, 30, 36, 42, 48, 54, 60

7's: 7, 14, 21, 28, 35, 42, 49, 56, 63, 70

8's: 8, 16, 24, 32, 40, 48, 56, 64, 72

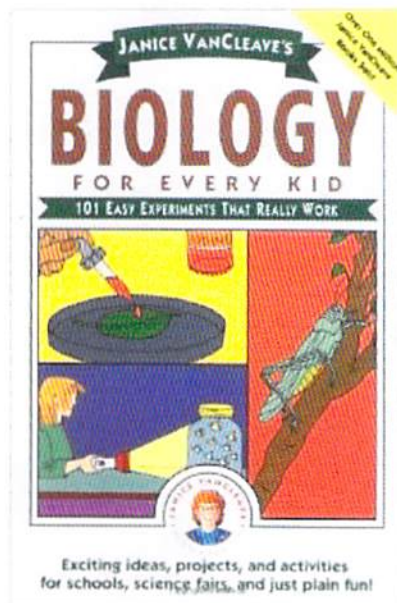
9's: 9, 18, 27, 36, 45, 54, 63, 72, 81, 90

10's: 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, 70, 80, 90, 100

Book 1



Biology for Every Kid – Janice VanCleave's

The book above contains 101 fun science experiments for kids. In addition each student will be required to keep a science journal during the summer. I am asking the students to do at least 5 of these experiments and record them in their science journal. This journal will be used to write down the student's observation of each experiment. The student will write down materials used, a hypothesis (what they think will happen), method (what they did in the experiment), a conclusion (what actually happened), and questions they may have from the result. Fandex Family Field Guides: Trees – Steven Aronson

The book contains 50 die-cut cards for a foolproof field guide. I am asking the students to identify at least 5 trees and record them in their science journal. The students should record their findings in their journal with facts about the tree, a sketch of the tree including leaves, nuts, and bark patterns. If a leaf has fallen from the tree the student should press it in their journal as well, please don't pull anything from the tree. Please bring the journal the first day of school it will be used throughout the year.
