

2nd Grade Summer Resources

Dear Rising 2nd Grade Parents and Students,

We are so excited to kick off the new school year! We can not wait to spend the year with you learning so many new things and making fun memories together! We already have some really epic field trips planned for us! We are so excited!! To prepare your child for 2nd grade, we highly encourage each student to read for at least 20 minutes each day. As you read with your child, we recommend talking with them about the text in order to strengthen their comprehension skills. Here are some questions to ask your child:

- Can you make a prediction about what will happen next?
- Who were the main characters? How did these characters respond to different events/problems in the story?
- Can you retell what happened in the story?
- What was the central message of the story? What did the characters learn? How can you apply that to your life?
- When you got stuck on a word you did not know, what strategy did you use to help you figure out the meaning?
- If you are reading a nonfiction text, what text features can you identify? How do they help you understand the text? (diagrams, headings, captions, glossary, etc)

Math fact fluency is also a critical skill in second grade. Please practice addition and subtraction facts weekly with flashcards (can be bought at the Dollar Tree or Dollar General or Walmart). We have also enclosed practice sheets you can put in a page protector and use dry erase markers on.

Here are some of our favorite educational websites:

- typing.com → we do a lot of typing on Chromebooks so this would be helpful to have them practice for free.
- Epic → reading website that has thousands of fun books. Students can also take quizzes to earn prizes.
- Extra Math
- Prodigy → fun math and reading game on your child's level that helps them master standards while having fun
- Rocket Math → App for iPhone, iPad, and Androids that they can play to strengthen math fact fluency as you travel, etc.

We hope that you all have a great summer and look forward to seeing you soon!

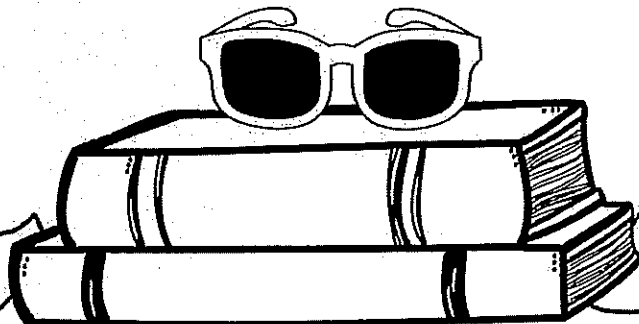
